SECTION 7: Handling and storage	
7.1. Precautions for safe handling	
Safe use of the product	 The product must be handled in accordance with good industrial hygiene and safety procedures. Do not eat, drink or smoke while working with the product. Wash hands after use. Wear personal protective equipment (See section 8). Only experienced and properly instructed persons should handle gases under pressure. Consider pressure relief device(s) in gas installations.

	Ensure the complete gas system was (or is regularily) checked for leaks before use. Use only properly specified equipment which is suitable for this product, its supply pressure and temperature. Contact your gas supplier if in doubt. Avoid suck back of water, acid and alkalis. Do not breathe gas. Avoid release of product into work area.
Safe handling of the gas receptacle	 Refer to supplier's container handling instructions. Protect containers from physical damage; do not drag, roll, slide or drop. When moving cylinders, even for short distances, use a cart (trolley, hand truck, etc.) designed to transport cylinders. Leave valve protection caps in place until the container has been secured against either a wall or bench or placed in a container stand and is ready for use. If the protection cap is too tight, remove it with adjustable wrench. Never insert sharp objects into the cavities of the cap, this can lead to damage to the valve and leakage. Open valve slowly to avoid pressure shock. If user experiences any difficulty operating valve discontinue use and contact supplier.

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Never attempt to repair or modify container valves or safety relief devices. Damaged valves should be reported immediately to the supplier. Keep container valve outlets clean and free from contaminants particularly oil and water. Replace valve outlet caps or plugs and container caps where supplied as soon as container is disconnected from equipment. Close container valve after each use and when empty, even if still connected to equipment. Never attempt to transfer gases from one cylinder/container to another. Never use direct flame or electrical heating devices to raise the pressure of a container. Do not allow backfeed into the container. Suck back of water into the container must be prevented. Do not remove or deface labels provided by the supplier for the identification of the content of the container.

Store containers in location free from fire risk and away from sources of heat and ignition. Keep away from combustible materials.
